

## Let's go boating - online! acbs-pnw.org

We'd like you to take a look at your new Pacific Northwest chapter website at acbs-pnw.org. You'll see a list of upcoming events with a link to more details, how to join, and photo albums of some event highlights.

There are a few steps to take to create a log in and password in order to see the Members section. On the home page, click on the little person login icon in the top right corner. Enter your email address then click on Forgot Password. An email will be sent to you with log in instructions. Follow those prompts and set up your password.

Under the Members menu, there are dropdown choices for the Directory, an archive of Newsletters, the PNW board members and Meeting minutes. Only members when logged in can see this area.

You can update your own information displayed in the Directory. You'll want to add your boat name(s). U¬nder the same little person log in/out icon, choose View Profile. You can add a small head shot to your profile, In order to add some boat pictures, click on Member Photo Album and Create and name your album. Follow the online instructions to create your album and upload pictures.
